## What is a Seaman's Book?

Recognized worldwide, the Panamanian Seaman's Book, also known as the Seafarer's Identification and Record Book, is an official document that certifies the holder as a Seaman, per The International Convention of Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping (STCW). It serves as both an identification document and a record of a seafarer's maritime career, detailing employment history, sea service, and qualifications.

Whilst the Seaman's Book does not replace the requirement to hold a valid passport and correct visa, it can be used to assist in certain cases when transiting and entering/exiting port state controls, as well as in the processing of work visa applications for certain destination countries.

There are no nationality restrictions on who can apply for a Seaman's Book.

### How long is a Seaman's Book valid for?

Seaman's Books are generally issued with a validity of five years.

### How long does the application take?

Processing time will vary between 2 - 4 weeks, subject to submission availability at the applying embassy.
